

My Dear People:

May is illuminated by the light of the Resurrection. Encompassing the forty days of Eastertide, the month ends with the ten-day season of Ascensiontide beginning on the Feast of the Ascension, May 29th. Even so, May is dedicated to Our Lady, and as such we celebrate the Mother of the Church with the May Festival on May 11th. Combining it with the still-fresh observance of the Resurrection should make it all the merrier!

The May Sundays in Eastertide—including Rogation Sunday when we ask God to bless our efforts in agriculture, animal husbandry, and industry so that there will be an abundant harvest—means that the feasts which transition into Summer, Whitsunday or Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, and Sacred Heart, are in June.

The May Festival is a highlight of the year for the Society of Mary. Usually, they organize a reception following the 10:00 a.m. Mass. If the weather is favourable and we a couple of strong men in attendance, there will be a procession around the church with the statue of Our Lady of Fatima. The hymns and the liturgy make secular Mother's Day something very special, as we honour the Mother of God who is also our Mother. I hope you will join us in celebrating the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Sixth Sunday of Easter, commonly called Rogation Sunday, is on May 25th. We pray that Almighty God will bless the efforts of seed-time, industrial work, and other aspects of our daily life and work. Living in a non-Agrarian society, we take for granted the considerable effort that goes into providing food, clothing, and all the comforts we have come to expect. *All things come of thee, O Lord: and of thine own have we given thee.* When we acknowledge that all we have comes from God, the Harvest Thanksgiving in Autumn makes perfect sense. The Rogation procession after the High Mass is semi-penitential in form. The Sacred Ministers exchange white vestments for violet, and the Litany of the Saints is chanted in procession. Weather permitting, we will bless the gardens.

May 29th is the fortieth day of Easter, the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Ascension commemorates the moment when Our Lord ascended into heaven, taking our human nature with

him. The lesson from the Acts of the Apostles—which is a restatement of this event in the Gospel of St. Luke—relates that the disciples were staring into the place where Jesus had receded from their sight. An angel reminds them to quit gazing up to heaven because Our Lord will return in the same way he ascended into heaven. Our Saviour told them to go and prepare themselves for the arrival of the Holy Spirit. So, the disciples returned to the Upper Room, which they had rented for the Passover and the other High Holy Days, to pray and prepare for something they did not yet fully understand.

In recent times the Church has tended to gloss over the Ascension, going directly from Easter to Pentecost. This is to miss the truth of the Ascension itself. The resurrected and glorified humanity of Jesus is not discarded when he ascends to his Father's side. Thus, humanity is restored to true and eternal life at the Resurrection. In the Ascension humanity takes its rightful place in the heavenly Jerusalem. High Mass of the Feast will be celebrated at 6:30 p.m. The preacher that night is Father Chrys Frank, Vicar of St. Mary Magdalene Equal to the Apostles Mission. Dinner will follow Mass. Tickets are \$10 each. A sign up sheet has been provided at the back of the church for scalloped potatoes and salad. The entrée and dessert are provided.

The Feast of Pentecost, also called Whitsunday, is on June 8th. After the 10:00 a.m. Mass, St. Michael's Pentecost Champagne Brunch, Silent Auction, and Giveaway gets underway. Tickets for the brunch went on sale on April 27th. Please buy your brunch (\$15 per person) and giveaway tickets (\$2 individually or a Packet of 50 for \$50 until June 1 for a 50% discount) as soon as possible. In keeping with the other events of the Centennial Year, a delicious meal will be served, followed by good fellowship and fun. Many thanks to those who are organizing the brunch as well as the Silent Auction and the Giveaway prizes.

Although Trinity Sunday isn't until June 15th, please don't forget to send in your names for graduates to be congratulated by inclusion in the Graduation Bouquet. Send your graduate's name into the office by Monday, June 9th, and it will be printed in the bulletin on Trinity Sunday.

Corpus Christi will round out the cycle of feasts which began with Easter. On June 19th, High Mass of Corpus Christi with a procession around the church of the Blessed Sacrament, weather permitting, takes place at 6:30 p.m. The Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament sponsors a relaxed Hot Dog Supper which is always a parish favourite. It's a great way to "close out" for a short time, the liturgical observances for which St. Michael's is known, until August.

So, due to the lateness of Easter, May and June are very busy months. Anglo-Catholic churches like St. Micheal's, take the observance of the liturgical calendar quite seriously. It's our duty as Christians to make sure these times are marked by the finest worship we can offer. The clergy, organist, choirmaster, choir, acolytes, and altar guild bring their best efforts to these celebrations. Will you be present for all or some of them? It would be so encouraging to staff, parishioners and those visiting St. Michael's to see the pews occupied for these festivities.

Books 'n' Brunch




Books 'n' Brunch will meet as usual at 12:00PM, Sunday, May 4, in the Parish Hall and on Zoom.


